Louisiana 2012 Reportable Disease List

All veterinarians practicing veterinary medicine in the state shall report any of the diseases listed below to the Louisiana State Veterinarian within 24 hours after making a diagnosis or tentative diagnosis of any such disease. Information reported should include:

- 1. Name, address, and phone number of the owner
- 2. Location of the premises
- 3. Morbidity and mortality rate at the time of reporting
- 4. Number of susceptible species in the immediate area
- 5. Approximate number of animals or poultry exposed
